

Report of the AJAE Editors for 2006

June 2007

The editorial team of Christopher B. Barrett (Cornell University), Paul V. Preckel (Purdue University), Stephen K. Swallow (University of Rhode Island) and Walter N. Thurman (North Carolina State University) undertook the management of *AJAE* on January 1, 2006, with responsibility for Volumes 89 and 90 to be published in 2007 and 2008. Both Ian Sheldon (Ohio State University) and B. Wade Brorsen (Oklahoma State University) concluded their four year editorial terms in 2006. We thank them for the extraordinary dedication, energy and talent they contributed during their tenure editing the *AJAE*. We continue the collaborative, multi-university editorial management process that was initiated with Volume 80 and described in *AJAE* Vol. 80, No.5, pp: 1224-1228. The Journal's editorial operations are described on the *AJAE* web site at <http://ajae.aem.cornell.edu/documents/editorialoperations.pdf>. Since March 2004, the *AJAE* employs a fully electronic editorial management system. Authors and referees can access instructions and the online submission portal through the Journal's web site at <http://ajae.aem.cornell.edu>.

Chris Barrett has responsibility for overseeing and maintaining the *Journal's* electronic editorial management system and also the Journal's web site and portal at Cornell. Immediate past editor Wade Brorsen handled the responsibilities of assembling materials for the December proceedings issue in 2006. Paul Preckel has taken over that responsibility beginning with the 2007 volume. Stephen Swallow serves as the Editors' liaison to the AAEA Executive Board, served as production editor for Volume 88, has the responsibility of supervising selection of the Outstanding *AJAE* Article. Wally Thurman now serves as production editor, which involves assembling accepted manuscripts, organizing issue layout, and serving as the liaison between the Editors and Blackwell Publishers concerning production scheduling and disposition of galley and page proofs. Through Blackwell's Online Early service, the *AJAE* has begun releasing papers electronically once they are typeset and approved by authors. This makes *AJAE* papers available to subscribers via the Internet before the hard copy of the relevant issue is produced, often several months in advance.

The *AJAE* web site continues to include a regularly updated listing of forthcoming papers (<http://ajae.aem.cornell.edu/forthcoming.htm>). Some adjustments were made to the *AJAE* style sheet beginning with the 2006 volume. The editors also arranged for *AgEcon Search*, hosted by the University of Minnesota, to post supplemental technical appendices for published *AJAE* articles on their web site for reliable availability to readers. While authors may still maintain their own web-based supplements, any materials to which a published article would have previously referred as "available on request" are now posted to the *AgEcon Search* database for easy online access by prospective readers. This online technical appendix arrangement seems to be working well.

The 2006 volume of the *AJAE* contains 73 articles. In addition, 4 comments, rejoinders or replies, and 20 book reviews were published. The December 2005 papers and proceedings issue

contains 24 principal papers and associated discussions, the Presidential and Fellows Addresses and the Waugh Lecture, and the Award-Winning Undergraduate Paper that were presented at the AAEA annual meetings, Long Beach, California, in July 2006.

The editors received 337 new manuscript submissions between 1 January and 31 December 2006. This submission rate is 8.7% higher than the mean annual rate of 310 between 1 January 2003 and 31 December 2005, and 9.1% higher than the 309 new submissions received in calendar year 2005. Table 1 presents the disposition of all manuscripts received 1 January – 31 December 2006. Out of 501 editorial decisions made during the year, a final decision was made for 320 manuscripts. Of these, 78 were accepted for publication, an acceptance rate of 24.4 percent, up slightly from the 2003-2005 average acceptance rate of 23.4%. The stock of manuscripts with authors for revision decreased slightly, by 7 (6.5%) over that same period, to 101. Of these, nearly half, (43 manuscripts) are inactive, having been in the hands of authors for at least twelve months, since prior to January 1, 2006.

Table 2 presents the total manuscript handling time – defined as the days elapsed from the time a manuscript is received by the AJAE until a response is mailed to the corresponding author – for editorial decisions reached during calendar year 2006, as compared against 2003-2005. Manuscript handling time does not include days when a manuscript returned for revision is with the author(s) after an editorial decision and prior to resubmission. Time to editorial decisions has decreased significantly, likely attributable in large measure to the AJAE's move to an electronic editorial management system. Time to initial decision decreased from a median of 94 days in 2003-2005 – which we sense was already very good relative to peer journals in economics – to only 74 days in 2006. The 2006 median response time for all decisions (including resubmissions, not just first decisions) was 11.5 days for accepted papers, 85 days for papers

returned for revisions, and 80 days for rejected manuscripts (corresponding figures for 2003-2005 were 50, 95 and 91 days, respectively).

Amit Batabyal, the Book Review Editor, received 70 books, monographs, and reports during the period 1 January-31 December 2006. The materials received cover a number of areas such as agricultural economics, development economics, ecological economics, environmental economics, international trade, and natural resource economics. Approximately 65% of the materials relate to North America and the remaining 35% cover Europe, Asia, Africa, and Australia; 27 reviews were commissioned during this period and 18 of these reviews have been accepted and have been sent to the publisher.

Journal production is progressing smoothly with all issues being delivered to readers on time in 2006. Table 3 presents the circulation and usage of the *AJAE* among institutional subscribers/users. The editors and publisher are delighted to report that the overall circulation of *American Journal of Agricultural Economics* increased by 11% during 2006, from 5,584 to 6,210, due primarily to growth in institutional circulation from 3,303 to 3,998. While traditional, hard copy institutional subscriptions were down slightly from 1,012 to 975, electronic-only circulation of the *AJAE* jumped again in 2006. Another 3,108 libraries have access through licensed databases. Individual subscriptions via AAEA membership decreased further, from 2,281 to 2,122, a decrease from 2005 of 3.0%. Visibility of the *AJAE* continues to be significantly enhanced by online access, in part through Blackwell Publishers' negotiated consortia agreements. In 2005, Blackwell increased the number of libraries opting for inclusion in

national consortia to 3,324, an increase of 31%. Philanthropic (free or low paid access) to the AJAE increased in 2006 by 45.8%, to 1,350 institutions with consortia access. The AJAE is available electronically through service providers such as Blackwell's Synergy and Ingenta at no extra cost to members of institutions that subscribe to the print version, and to all consortia. AJAE articles were downloaded a total of 339,992 times in 2006, an increase of 46 percent over 2005 downloads. The most heavily accessed article via Synergy (P.C. Benitez, T. Kuosmanen, R. Olschewski and G.C. van Kooten, "Conservation Payments under Risk: A Stochastic Dominance Approach") was downloaded 794 times.

The full text of all articles in the *Journal of Farm Economics* (1919-1967) and the AJAE (1968-1995) are available online through the Core Historical Library of Agriculture (CHLA), made available by Cornell University's Mann Library (<http://chla.library.cornell.edu/>). CHLA can be browsed or searched, with articles available in pdf or text format. The 1996-99 volumes are currently in the process of being added to CHLA. Full text electronic versions of all AJAE articles since 2000 are available to current subscribers through Blackwell Publishing. In addition, the full text of all articles in the *Journal of Farm Economics* (1919-1967) and the AJAE (1968-2000) are available through JSTOR's Arts and Sciences and Business Complements at <http://www.jstor.org/journals/00029092.html>. All of these resources are accessible through the AJAE web site (<http://ajae.aem.cornell.edu/>). Links to the AJAE's pre-2000 issues are also being added to the Research Papers in Economics database (RePEc.org) so as to enhance visibility and accessibility to earlier material from the *Journal*.

The AJAE continues to maintain its status as the premier journal in the field, and it ranks on a par with many of the most respected general economics journals worldwide. This reputation is reflected in many different imperfect measures. For example, in 2006 the AJAE had more than four times as many gross citations as any other agricultural and resource economics journal and had both the highest impact factor,² a measure of immediate impact on subsequent published

research, and the longest cited half-life,³ a measure of long-term impact on research, which indicates the durability of published findings (Table 4). Citations of *AJAE* articles rose 7.3% in 2006 from the previous year. The *AJAE*'s impact factor climbed from 0.622 in 2004, to 0.927 in 2005, to 1.196 in 2006,⁴ while its cited half-life consistently remained at the maximum reported level of >10.0 years. By citations-related metrics the *AJAE* likewise ranks with the leading journals both in environmental and resource economics and in development and international economics. These statistics indicate that the *AJAE* remains one of the elite journals in economics more broadly. Its citations statistics are similar to those of premier general economics journals such as *International Economic Review*, *Journal of Law and Economics*, *Journal of Monetary Economics*, and *Journal of Public Economics*, and are superior to those of quite a few highly respected general economics journals such as *Economic Inquiry*, *Economica*, *Economics Letters*, *European Economic Review*, *Journal of Business and Economic Statistics*, and *Oxford Economic Papers*. Kalaitzidakis, Stengos and Mamuneas (*Journal of the European Economic Association*, 2003) ranked the *AJAE* 34th out of 159 economics journals, while Kodrzycki and Yu (Federal Reserve Bank of Boston working paper, 2005) rank it 23rd out of 178 economics journals in policy impact, 28th in impact on non-economics journals, and 31st in overall impact. Since those assessments used data that predate the recent, sharp (absolute and relative) improvement in the *AJAE*'s citations statistics, we believe these rankings are a conservative assessment of the current status of the *Journal*.
